While I was in attendance of the United Nations CSW62 in New York, ACWW's World President, Ruth Shanks, and Media Specialist, Nick Newland, presented the facts on why we developed the survey and introduced the website. In the World Presidents speech, she spoke on how the Global Survey addresses the living conditions of rural women and how ACWW is working to

raise the voices of these women everywhere. ACWW wants to ensure that all communities have a voice on the global stage. There were many NGO's from all parts of the world in attendance. Each NGO leader was excited and willing to be part of this worldwide survey.

Now we must do our part and participate in this survey. Information and instructions can be found on ACWW's website (acww.org.uk) and <a href="www.ifrw.org.uk">www.ifrw.org.uk</a>. The survey will take around 15-20 minutes. ACWW is calling this a base line survey. It is felt that this is a good starting point for a more in-

depth survey in the future. Encourage all your members, friends, and families to raise the voices of women worldwide and participate in this global research survey. Use @ruralwomenforum to tweet it out.

## Tuesday: General Zebulon Pike Lock & Dam No. 11

## General Zebulon Pike Lock and Dam No. 11

is a lock and dam located between Dubuque, Iowa and rural Grant County, Wisconsin, on the Upper Mississippi River.

It was opened to navigation 14 September 1937.

The movable portion of

the dam is 1,478 feet (450.5 m) long and consists of 13 tainter gates and three roller gates. The non-movable part is a 3,340 feet (1,018.0 m) long non-overflow earthen dam that connects to the Wisconsin shore. The main lock is 110 feet (33.5 m) wide by 600 feet (182.9 m) long. There is also an incomplete auxiliary lock.

## **ACWW Project #1023 Update**

Deepam Trust reports that 250 Dalit women and their families are benefiting from improved regular access to adequate food and better nutritional health through the small scale cultivation of a wide variety of organic crops. Five two-day training sessions were organized and the group reports that a total of 250 women attended them. Furthermore, all these women received seed kits and planted the seeds in their own garden.

As a result of 300 meetings at village level in 25 Villages in Thanjavur district, the targeted women gained knowledge of, food safety awareness,

basic health, sustainable cooking methods, organic home garden preparation, and reducing malnutrition. All of them were also encouraged to obtain vitamin A drops and deworming tablets for their children from government departments.

The project team dealt with difficulties encountered such as a lack of water in hand pumps and they advised the beneficiaries to use waste water. Six women were discouraged from attending the training by their drug addict husbands. The Trust 'offered counselling and the women then did attend.

Deepam Trust evalu-

ates the project implementation process with weekly and monthly meetings, as well as through direct discussions with project beneficiaries.

In the last stage of the project all 250 women will continue their food security training and no complications are expected to arise. The team is planning to guide and advise the beneficiaries on organic pest management and the use of manure, water harvesting and conservation, and seed collection in order to cultivate vegetables the following season.

Hazel Armstrong is monitoring this project.


